 - a. How widespread is the practice of using a non-OASIS, comprehensive assessment tool?
 - b. Do they use a non-OASIS, comprehensive assessment tool for skilled and unskilled care patients?
- 2. Do you work with any HHAs that have *only* non-Medicare/Medicaid patients?
 - a. What comprehensive assessment tool do they use to assess patients?
 - b. Is it the same tool for skilled and unskilled care patients?
- 3. Do you have a sense of how many non-OASIS, comprehensive assessment tools are in use by HHAs around the country?
- 4. Do you have a sense of the approximate percent of the national HHA population you serve that is comprised of non-Medicare/Medicaid patients?
 - a. Do you have a sense of the trend in the makeup of Medicare/Medicaid population for the HHAs that you serve?
 - b. Do you have any suggestions for alternative sources that would inform CMS as to the makeup of the national makeup of non-Medicare/Medicaid population?
- 5. What issues of burden should CMS consider when evaluating an OASIS all-payer proposal?
